SHARING THROUGH MATHEMATICS



A lot of what we learn in school is based on adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing. You might go as far as to say, your well-being has a great deal to do with mathematics, maybe even more than learning by sharing with others.

Greetings all. As I look outside and see that winter is finally losing its grip on us, I am excited for the year ahead.

We would like to thank our members, suppliers, and guests for your attendance at the 2023 Annual Operators Seminar.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the charitable donation activities, the 50/50 draws and the Silent Auction! Your participation and generosity make our yearly charitable donations a success.

Our donation to the Water School this April was \$23,940.00.

The project that our AWWOA donations will be championing in 2023 is a 'Motorized Borehole Expansion' in Petta, Uganda. Petta, is a sub-county in Eastern Uganda that has a new motorized borehole that was recently built. It serves 2,450 people across four communities.

With AWWOA's help, the plan is to extend the reach of the borehole to help an additional 2,560 people in three more villages, which will include 1,016 students at Mbula-Machari Primary School. This 2.7 km expansion would provide 25 litres of clean water per person per day in these communities through one new public tap stand in each community and a tap stand at the school. Included in this, all 512 households in these communities will participate in Water School's flagship hygiene and sanitation training.

I would like to take this opportunity to invite you all to sign up for the upcoming Golf Tournament in Whitecourt in June where we will have fundraising opportunities with 50/50 and mulligan sales.

Important Renewal Information

- Renewal window opens July 1, 2023 and will remain open until December 31, 2023. To avoid delays and possible certification inactivation, please do not wait until the last week of December to renew.
- Please make sure to check what courses you are selecting to use for your renewal. Click the *Generate Report* button (in the Training tab) to help you visualize your renewal period (21/22/23). Discipline specific training will be required.



- When renewing, a fee of \$130.00 is to be paid through your account in Compliance35 (regardless of number of disciplines). Information on how to submit your fee will be outlined in Compliance 365. Anticipate using a credit card for payment.
- If you do not renew by December 31, 2023, you will be reactivating and the fee will be \$130.00/discipline. Please make sure you renew on time.

Exams

Exam sessions occur every two months, and are 60 days in length in which Operators have the flexibility to schedule their exam any day within that window **depending on testing enter dates available.

If you miss the 60-day window once approved, you will be marked Absent and will need to apply for a Re-Examination using your Account in Compliance when ready to do so.

Reminders

- Please make sure your supervisor is correct on your profile before you apply for a renewal or certification exam.
- Submit all training and wait for it to be approved prior to submitting your renewal request.
- To avoid delays, once you submit your renewal or exam please inform your supervisor as he/she will have to log into their account and approve.
