



Water Treatment Plant Level I Operator

The Town of Stettler is looking to fill the full time position of Water Treatment Plant Operator Level I. The Town of Stettler has a regional water treatment plant supplying water to more than 13 communities. This position is based on a 40 hour work week, and includes on-call duty and rotational work with weekend shifts once a month. The successful candidate will have experience in operation and maintenance of water treatment plants to ensure that residents have safe and clean water in accordance with the term and conditions of Alberta Environment Protection Act and its Approval. You will be a highly motivated person with a valid class five license. You are joining an existing team at the water treatment plant and duties will include:

- Maintains the membrane filtration and chemical treatment processes, waste ponds, lift station and other equipment associated with the water works system
- Conducts regular daily inspections of the physical plant to ensure effective operations, monitors and makes necessary plant adjustments
- Performs routine sampling and records laboratory tests to monitor water treatment process. Ensures computerized entries of all operational parameters are maintained, keeps a daily log of plant activities
- Carries out preventative maintenance and repair of equipment
- Unloads and stocks chemicals and other material, monitors and fills chemical day tanks
- Cleans and maintains all facilities and buildings including general grounds maintenance and snow removal of walkways and dock
- Possess operational knowledge of SCADA system, ability to understand oral and written instructions
- Must be able to work in a safe and efficient manner with minimum supervision. Required to work in confined space and handle hazardous chemicals
- Required to take on-call duty on a rotational basis and work a variety of schedules

- Must maintain through formal education and self study all certifications and upgrades as required for regulatory compliance

You must be a highly motivated person with the ability to handle stressful, changing work environments with minimal supervision. You have a valid class five drivers license, a minimum grade twelve high school education, or equivalent. Candidate must have certification from Alberta Environment with a Level I in Water Treatment.
