

One Water Approach: Integrated Solutions for Sustainable Water Management

This one-day workshop will explore the One Water Approach, a strategy that promotes integrated water management by treating all water sources—freshwater, stormwater, wastewater, source water, and drinking water—as interconnected resources within a cohesive system.

Alberta Environment & Protected Areas Update

Operator In Training (OIT)

Alberta-specific OIT Certification is now available. If you meet the criteria and wish to obtain an OIT Certificate, please e-mail EPA to request an application form. OIT is not mandatory and is not eligible for reciprocity.

- Completion of Approved Mandatory Training Course for Level I (minimum 1.2 CEUs)
- Grade 12 or equivalent
- Pass Level I Certification exam

Waiting Period Between Exam Results

The waiting period between exams for re-writes has been reduced to 30 days. You are eligible to apply 30 days after an unsuccessful attempt. The exam approval will follow the same process as all certification exams.

Direct Responsible Charge (DRC) Plan

DRC Plans are required for municipalities that require more than one operator obtaining DRC hours at the same time. There are two forms that must be completed. Forms are located on the EPA Operator Portal under Resources.

- The DRC Facility Plan must be filled out by the facility authorized approver (owner/representative)
- The DRC Operator form must be completed by each operator applying for Level III and IV
- Both forms must be uploaded into the operator's exam application

Certificate Renewal Without Experience

Operators can renew and maintain their certification without experience with no limit on renewals as per the below requirements:

- CEU requirement has been met as per the Water and Wastewater Operator Certification Guidelines
- Apply for renewal in the EPA Operator Portal and pay the renewal fee as per the Water and Wastewater Operator Certification Guidelines

This change will be retroactive to certificates that have been inactive for three years or less. If the certificate became inactive in 2022, 2023 or 2024, the certificate can be reactivated, once the CEU requirement is met. A reactivation fee of \$130 will apply if you do not have an active certification. If you have an active certification, there will be no extra charges. Please send an e-mail once you have applied so that the fees can be reviewed.
